Active Fires & Air Quality Updates:

[Cal Fire Incidents]

• Current emergency incidents and ongoing emergency responses in California, including all 10+ acre wildfires.

[InciWeb]

• InciWeb is an interagency all-risk incident information management system. A number of supporting systems automate the delivery of incident information to remote sources. This ensures that the information regarding active incidents is consistent, and the delivery is timely.

[Fire and Smoke Map]

• The Interagency Wildland Fire Air Quality Response Program (IWFAQRP) was created to directly assess, communicate, and address risks posed by wildland fire smoke to the public as well as fire personnel. The program depends on four primary components: specially trained personnel called Air Resource Advisors, air quality monitoring, smoke concentration and dispersion modeling, and coordination and cooperation with agency partners.
