Wildfire Evacuation Pocket Guide

What to do immediately before, during, and after an evacuation.

BEFORE

- Turn your vehicle around so it is facing the road.
- Have a paper map with multiple exit routes.
- Adhere to any evacuation alerts, orders, or warnings.
- Close doors and windows but keep them unlocked.
- Locate pets, keep carriers/ crates nearby, determine shelter availability.
- Add last-minute items to your evacuation kit and keep by door.
- keep by door.
 Charge cell phone and other necessary electronic devices.

DURING ►Evacuate if threatened or

- when ordered by officials.

 Leave a note with names of people, license plate,
- planned destination, time/date you left.

 Leave interior and
- exterior lights on.

 Call or text an out-of-area
- contact to let them know you are evacuating.

 Follow guidance of officials to determine the
- safest evacuation route.Avoid traveling on roads near burning vegetation.

on recirculate.

 Drive with headlights on, windows closed, and AC

AFTER

- Check in with Red Cross, neighborhood contacts,
- and family members.Let your out-of-area contact know you've
- made it out safely.
 Do not return home until officials say it's safe to do so.
- Check for hot spots, damaged trees, loose rocks, embers, and fire damage.
- Do not drink from water supply until officials say it's safe.
- Discard any food that has been exposed to heat, smoke, or soot.
